Some of these insects are more active in daytime and others at night. Look around the greenhouse for different ways of telling them apart and write your answers here.

Butterfly	Moth
<p>Active in daytime</p> <p>Clubbed antennae</p> <p>Slender bodies</p> <p>Often very colourful wings</p> <p>Wings usually closed at rest</p> <p>Bare chrysalis</p>	<p>Active at dusk or at night</p> <p>Various shapes of antennae</p> <p>Stout, hairy bodies</p> <p>Often dull-coloured wings</p> <p>Wings open at rest</p> <p>Chrysalis (pupa) inside a cocoon</p>
