When you visit the **Biodôme**you'll get to be a **marine** biologist, conducting research into the St. Lawrence **Marine Ecosystem**. The St. Lawrence flows past **Montréal**, and its water is fresh at this point. It starts in the Great Lakes and flows all the way to the Atlantic after a voyage of 1,167 km. The part of the River you will be studying is called the **marine estuary**. It is cold **salt** water, teeming with life. You'll see twelve animal species in four different **habitats**: the rocky shore, the River bottom, the cliffs and the saltwater marsh.
